
Teachers will take you on a tour of the school facilities, providing with clear instructions and essential information regarding student life.

Those who require English language testing will be tested on Orientation Day to ensure they are placed in the appropriate classes. The test is comprised of a writing and speaking portion.







House System

Alexander Academy has four houses, named after admirable Canadians: Terry Fox, David Suzuki, Emily Carr, and Margaret Atwood. Each Alexandrian is placed into a house (like in Harry Potter) at the start of the year. The houses compete in several sporting, academic and cultural activities for house points, which are awarded by teachers based on participation as well as respectable behaviour.

How does the House System work?

1.

All students are assigned a house upon their arrival at Alexander Academy. They will remain members of this House for the duration of their stay at Alexander Academy.

House points earned will be tallied and displayed each week posted near the student entrance.

2.

House teams will form the basis of many completions at Alexander Academy, e.g. sports days, intra-mural activities, public speaking competitions.

4.

Students can earn House points for their house by participating in school activities, being successful in school activities, showing improvement or outstanding performance in academic work, and observing school rules and expectations.

Student Support System

Learning Centre

We offer a daily drop-in Learning Centre as part of our after-school offerings for extra academic support, and you will be able to receive academic teacher and/or peer support in relaxed but structured environment. MyEd BC, Canvas & Turnitin

MyEducation BC

If you are a student, you will receive your login info from MyEd BC through the email address you provided us before or on Orientation day.

If you are a parent, you will receive a separate email from a MyEd BC system about your login info through the email you provided us on your child's application.

Canvas

Canvas is a course management system used by Alexander Academy and may universities and colleges around the world. This platform will allow you to manage your courses and assignments in a timely manner. You will be signed up for Canvas by the school before your arrival.

Dashboard

In Dashboard, you can view notifications and current courses.

Announcement

In Announcements, you can view all the announcements in your course in reverse chronological order with the newest appearing first and the older announcements appearing towards the bottom.

Assignment

In Assignments, you can view all the assignments in your course, and assignments are grouped by:

- Overdue Assignments: assignments and discussions that are past the due date, are still available, have not been submitted and have not been graded.
- Upcoming Assignments: assignments, discussions, and quizzes that have an upcoming due date.
- Updated Assignments: assignments, discussions, and quizzes that do not have a due date.
- Past Assignments: assignments and discussion that are past the due date and either are not available, have seen submitted, or have received a grade; quizzes that are past the due date.

Each Assignment displays the assignment name, any availability dates for the assignment, due date (if any), and the number of points the assignment is worth.

To view the details of an assignment, such as instructions and rubric, click the name of the assignment. You will be able to submit an assignment by clicking the "Submit Assignment" Button to submit your work.

Grades

To view grades, click the name of an assignment you would like to check your grade. In the submission details, you will find "Show Rubric" link.

You can view the name of the assignment, the assignment due date, the assignment status, the score you earned, and the total point value of the assignment. You may also be able to view whether the assignment includes scoring details, comments, or rubrics.

Discussion

Each discussion displays whether or not it is a graded discussion, the name of the discussion, the date on which the last discussion reply was posted, the due date (due dates only apply to graded discussions), and the number of unread/total posts in the discussion, and whether or not you are subscribed to the discussion.

When a discussion is available for participation, you can view the Reply field beneath the discussion topic. To reply to the discussion, click the Reply button.

Turnitin

Please note that not all teachers will require you to use Turnitin to for assignment submission. If your teacher asks you to use Turnitin, he/she will let you know the registration code for the course for you to sign up.

All students taking PE (Grades 8-10 mandatory, Gr 11/12 elective) must have the full PE Uniform.

Students must have one of either the athletic jacket or sweat pants and athletic jacket or hoodie.

Uniform Policy

- ✓ Uniforms should be kept neat, clean and in good repair.
- ✓ Uniform pants are must be long enough to reach the shoes and worn with grey or balck dress socks.
- ✓ Girls may wear black or navy-blue tights or knee highs below the knee.
- ✓ Kilts are not to be shortened or worn more than 2" above the knee.
- ✓ Shoes may not be higher than 2 inches.
- ✓ Dress shirts are to be done up and always tucked in.
- ✓ Ties are to be properly worn.
- ✓ School sweater, vest or blazer is worn over the white shirt.
- ✓ Outerwear may not be worn in the class.
- Clothing that fails to conform to the school standard must be replaced at the student's expense.
- ✓ All school clothing is laundered or dry-cleaned regularly.

Important School Policies

Here are the important school policies that you should learn before the new semester starts:

Medical Insurance Policy

International Students

September/Fall Semester:

New BC residents arriving from foreign locations and returning BC residents arriving from outside Canada must provide proof of Private Medical Insurance that is valid for the duration of the academic school year (September to June 30th) in addition to being enrolled in the BC Medical Services Plan (MSP).

January/Winter semester:

New BC residents arriving from foreign locations and returning BC residents arriving from outside Canada must provide proof of Private Medical Insurance that is valid from January to June 30th. In the following September to June 30th school year, they must provide proof of Private Medical Insurance for the duration of the academic school year (September to June 30th) in addition to being enrolled in the BC Medical Services Plan (MSP).

Current BC Residents

When completing the registration process, please ensure that the school has your child's MSP Care Card number on file.

Canadians Arriving from another Province

If you are a Canadian citizen arriving to BC from another province, you must enrol your child in the Medical Services Plan of British Columbia upon arrival. You should maintain coverage from your previous medical plan as there is a three-month waiting period (90 days (about 3 months)) before MSP coverage can begin.



When to purchase the medical insurance

You are strongly advised to purchase your child's medical coverage before travelling to Canada. Accidents and unexpected illness can occur at any time, and having insurance in place before your child leaves home is the best way to protect you and your family.

You may purchase private medical insurance from any company of your choosing, providing that the insurance is valid for medical expenses in Canada.



The British Columbia Medical Services Plan (MSP)

MSP is the BC provincial Government basic medical insurance plan for all BC residents – including Temporary Residents such as international students. After residing for three months in the Province, international students holding a study permit valid for more than six (6) months are entitled to medical and hospital benefits through the government Medical Services Plan (MSP).

The BC Medical Services Plan Insurance will cover:

- Doctors consultations
- Hospital treatments
- X-rays and laboratory work



The BC Medical Service Plan Insurance will not cover:

- Prescription costs
- Ambulance journeys
- Alternative therapies
- Contact lenses
- Glasses
- Physiotherapy
- Chiropractor
- Dental
- Orthodontic treatment

Guard.Me - Private Insurance

A local insurance provider, Guard.Me, offers students a high quality and low-cost health insurance option designed for international students. You can obtain information by contacting the administration at Alexander Academy or by accessing the Guard Me website at www.quard.me/alexanderacademy.

*Please note that private medical insurance is subject to certain exclusion, such as exclusions, such as extreme sports, pre-existing conditions, and incidents involving drug or alcohol use. The applicant is responsible for reviewing the insurance terms which are located on the Guard.Me Website.



Attendance

If you are sick or will be unable to attend class, your parent, custodian, or homestay is responsible for contacting the school ahead of time either via email or phone to inform the front desk. Please note that you cannot be excused from school without approval by your guardian.

As attendance at Alexander Academy is compulsory, our attendance policy requires **90% attendance rate to receive credit for a class** in the belief that regular attendance promotes student learning.

Homestay

Students and their families are responsible for arranging the homestay for their child while studying at Alexander Academy. We do not promote, endorse, or arrange individual homestays; however, we provide a list of providers for families to choose from. As such, we endeavor to respect all the school-relevant provisions found in section 2 (International Student Program Responsibilities) of the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 International Student Homestay Guidelines (2018).

Ministry of Education – International Student Homestay Guidelines

Families and custodians must ensure that host families meet the following Ministry Guidelines.

Tuition Fees, How to make payments, Refund policies Refund Policy

All students

- All refund requests must be made in writing along with the submission of supplementary documents.
- Refunds are processed under the name of the student's parent unless an alternate request is submitted by the parent in writing.
- No refund is granted if parents fail to disclose medical needs, special learning needs or behavioural considerations.
- If a student is required to discontinue studies due to expulsion, the student is not eligible for a refund of any amount paid to Alexander Academy for the school year in which they were expelled. Further, a student is not eligible for a partial refund to cover an interruption to their studies due to disciplinary suspension of any kind, nor from an interruption of their studies arising from any other consequence assigned to the students because of their misbehaviour.

- The cancellation of acceptance according to Alexander Academy's admission policy will result in the loss of any non-refundable deposit.
- All fees paid are non-transferable.
- All refunds which are requested by wire transfer are subject to an administrative fee of \$100. Banks may charge additional transaction fees.
- Approved refund requests are processed within 4-6 weeks (about 1 and a half months).



International Students (Visa Refusal)

International students who have been issued an official Letter of Acceptance from Alexander Academy are not eligible for a refund unless the student's study permit application has been denied by Citizenship and Immigration Canada.

In the event of a Study Permit application denial, fees are fully refundable minus the **administration fee of \$300**. To receive a refund, the following documents must be submitted:

- ✓ Withdrawal form
- ✓ Request for Refund form
- ✓ Refusal letter issued by Citizenship and Immigration Canada. The date of the refusal letter must be after the issue date of the most recent Letter of Acceptance.

New Domestic Students

- Eligible for a 50% refund of the tuition and activity fees paid if the student withdraws 30 or more calendar days prior to the first day of school year.
- No refund is issued if the student withdraws 29 or fewer calendar days prior to the first day of school year.

Continuing Students (Domestic and International)

- A non-refundable tuition deposit of \$2,000 is required to guarantee a seat for an upcoming school year.
- 50% refund of the tuition and activity fees paid less \$2,000 deposit if the student withdraws 30 or more calendar days prior to the first day of school year.
- No refund is issued if the student withdraws 29 or fewer calendar days prior to the first day of school year.
