














Student Council and House Captains

- Student council members are provided the opportunity to experience leadership and encourage community relations.













CAS Experiences







Medical Insurance

All students must be enrolled in the BC Medical Services Plan (MSP).

In addition, international students must provide proof of Private Medical Insurance that is valid for the duration of the academic school year:

September intake – from Sept. to June

January intake – from Jan to June of their first year at Alexander Academy. In the fall, they will need to purchase from September to June.
